Food for Thought

Look at example K and example C (Dictionary.com part 3). This is my definition of choice for conversations/discussions. Why? First, it's simple and simple to memorize. Second, it reminds you to ask a question, in a discussion, about all 3 (cause, nature and purpose) principles mentioned in the definition. When someone declares:

"I'm an Atheist... Blah, Blah, Blah."

I might respond:

"Okay, but do you mind <u>defining</u> Atheism for me, so I can understand what you believe?"

This is key. Hold your definition in reserve. Normally, simply asking someone to define any word they use discombobulates them. It will amaze you. Whatever ultimately leaks out, focus on whether or not it suffices as a definition (no matter how silly or stupid). If it is not a definition, say,

"I can see this is something you care about, but I don't think that you defined 'Atheism', you know what I mean? Do you mind trying, again, to define it?"

You won't be ambushed by terms you haven't heard of. In the end, they are atheists with denominational distinctions like the Baptists have. I mean you have Baptists, Freewill Baptists, General Baptists, Southern Baptists, and so on. In the end, they are Baptists who, historically speaking, have had hobbyhorse doctrines and distinctions that many of them are still riding. Atheists are organized similar to Baptist churches, as independent governing bodies. They chatter on about independence, but it's silly, as they huddle together under mother's wings (mother being Harris, Dawkins, Hawking, and Hitchens) when you and I question their belief system.

I close this topic with this reminder. <u>Atheism is exploding around the globe. You</u> and I are to blame; we have been lazy, selfish, cowardly and ungrateful. It's time we change. If you are reading this, I believe that you, like me, intend to change. Here is the latest information I could garner on Atheism in the U.S.:

- Announced American Atheists: somewhere around one million one hundred thousand
- Percent of Americans who are non-religious = 26%-35%
